In order to drive a commercial vehicle in the U.S. with a maximum gross vehicle weight rating of over 10,000 lbs in interstate commerce, drivers are required to pass a physical examination given by a DOT-approved medical examiner to obtain and maintain a medical examiner's certificate.

No. The Medical Examiner is required to provide a copy of the Medical Examiner's Certificate (. 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 391.43(g)) to the motor carrier that employs the driver. A release form is not required. The motor carrier is required to keep a copy of the certificate in the driver qualification file.

A driver cannot take a controlled substance or prescription medication without a prescription from a licensed practitioner. If a driver uses a drug identified in 21 CFR 1308.11 (391.42(b)(12)) or any other substance such as amphetamine, a narcotic, or any other habit forming drug, The driver is medically unqualified.

The DOT requires each commercial truck driver to pass a physical exam, stating that you are in good enough health to operate heavy machinery safely on the roads. Once the driver has passed his or her medical examination, they are issued a DOT medical certification card for them to pass along to their employer for documentation.

DOT Physical Rule Changes for 2019 | DOT Physicals ...

Any individual with a physical or mental injury or disease which has impaired his/her ability to perform normal duties must have a physical examination and obtain a new medical examiner's certificate/DOT medical card. However, if returning from medical leave, a new physical is not necessarily required unless the employer questions the individual's abilities to perform his/her job duties.

The maximum certification for a person with diabetes is one year. According to DOT guidelines, a person with diabetes, whether controlled with diet alone or diet plus medication, must meet the following criteria: Maintain a glycosylated hemoglobin (Hemoglobin A1C or "HBA1C") of 10% or less.

Along with the request for waiver and pertinent medical report forms, the Division of Driver Licensing must receive a long form copy of the driver's last DOT physical examination. The Division of Driver Licensing will base its decision on granting the requested waiver from the information obtained from the medical report forms, the DOT physical, and the driving history of the applicant.
