

Dvorak In America 18921895

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Dvorak's stay in America lasted only four years (1892-95), but he made a profound impression, especially in his position as director of the National Conservatory in New York. This is a set of 26 independent essays by scholars on topics such as his influence on American music and musicians, studies of his compositions, and his American legacy.

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The most obvious of these are of course the Ninth Symphony, "From the New World," and the String Quartet No. 12, "American," but the period from 1892-1895 also produced the Sonatina in G for violin and piano, the E flat major String Quintet, the A major Suite for Orchestra, as well as the B minor Cello Concerto.

The Symphony No. 9 in E minor, "From the New World", Op. 95, B. 178, popularly known as the New World Symphony, was composed by Antonín Dvořák in 1893 while he was the director of the National Conservatory of Music of America from 1892 to 1895. It has been described as one of the most popular of all symphonies. In older literature and recordings, this symphony was – as for its first publication – numbered as Symphony No. 5. Some have heard suggestions of a locomotive in the last movement, recalling Dvořák's love of railroads. Dvořák quoted in the third movement, measures 21-24, a bird that he believed was a scarlet tanager, an American songbird. The song appears as a high, interrupting strain in the first violin part. Dvořák was annoyed by this bird's insistent chattering, and transcribed its song in his ...

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
