Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Chenin Blanc and Muscat Canelli are grown south of Lubbock, Texas. Since the industry is young, it will take time to make a firm determination as to which variety grows best where. The wineries in central Texas will depend heavily on grapes from the South Plains.

A Texas Grape and Wine History - Aggie Horticulture

These grapes are mostly native to America (Vitis labrusca). Muscadine grapes (Vitis roundifolia) are also American grapes. They are tolerant of greater heat and are often grown in the South. Muscadine grapes produce only half a dozen large grapes per cluster and are usually black or coppery purple colored.

Growing Backyard Grapes: Planting, Growing, Pruning

Texas wine grape growers produced 14,180 tons of grapes from 5,020 bearing acres in 2019. Production was up 22 percent from 11,660 tons produced in 2017. Bearing acres in vineyards for 2019 were up 11 percent from 4,541 acres from the last survey conducted in 2017. The average yield of 2.8 tons per acre was up 0.2 tons from the previous survey.
