Test Validity and Reliability. ... If, for example, rater A observed a child act out aggressively eight times, we would want rater B to observe the same amount of aggressive acts. If rater B witnessed 16 aggressive acts, then we know at least one of these two raters is incorrect.

The PRT is a simple, valid, and reliable measure that can be used with children with cerebral palsy.
